Why Recycling More is Good for Minnesota

Environmental Benefits

- In 2006, 41% of municipal solid waste was recycled, saving 46 trillion BTUs of energy
 — nearly enough energy to power all the homes in Ramsey County for one year.
- By increasing recycling, Minnesota can reduce the amount of waste that is landfilled.
 Landfills create harmful greenhouse gasses. In 2006, Minnesotans were responsible for landfilling over 2.1 million tons of waste.
- In 2003, recycling resulted in a net reduction of greenhouse gases of 6 million metric tons of CO₂, equal to taking more than 1.3 million cars off the road.
- Recycling reduces air and water pollution, as well as conserves our natural resources. Minnesotans save over 5 million trees each year by recycling.

Economic Benefits

- Minnesota throws away more than 1.3 million tons of recyclable material each year with an estimated value of \$312 million dollars. It costs Minnesota \$200 million to dispose of this material.
- Currently, recycling rates remain flat, while Minnesota is producing greater amounts of waste.
- Minnesota's recycling industry is directly and indirectly responsible for 20,000 jobs and \$64 million in tax revenue, and adds \$2.98 billion to the state economy.
- From 2001-2003, many sectors of the Minnesota economy lost jobs; the recycling industry gained 3.4% in employment.
- Minnesota's recycling and waste-to-energy facilities generate \$10 million in annual sales.

About Recycle More Minnesota

The Recycle More Minnesota campaign is a joint effort between the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and the Recycling Association of Minnesota to help increase awareness about recycling throughout the state. Established in 2008, we are working with our partners to promote recycling at home, work and on the go, with the goal of increasing the state recycling rate to 50% by 2011 through educational and social marketing efforts.
